1. Introduction

AIIMS Guwahati observed Anti-Ragging Day on 12 August 2026, marking the commencement of Anti-Ragging Week from 12 to 18 August 2026. The programme witnessed the active participation of faculty members and more than 400 students and reaffirmed the Institute's commitment to maintaining a safe, respectful, inclusive and ragging-free academic environment.

The observance focused on strengthening awareness of the seriousness of ragging, reinforcing individual and collective responsibility, and encouraging healthy peer relationships across the Institute. It also highlighted the importance of discipline, dignity and a supportive campus culture.

3. Anti-Ragging Pledge and Address by the Executive Director

The Anti-Ragging Pledge was administered by Prof. Ashok Puranik, Executive Director, AIIMS Guwahati. Addressing the gathering, he highlighted the importance of upholding a strict zero-tolerance policy towards ragging and emphasized the collective responsibility of all members of the Institute in promoting mutual respect, dignity and a supportive campus culture.

The address reinforced the message that concerns relating to ragging should never be ignored or normalized and that students and staff must actively contribute to a safe and respectful academic environment.

4. Sensitization of Students

Prof. Muralidhar Reddy Sangam, Dean (Academics), addressed the students and reiterated the Institute's firm commitment to ensuring a safe, respectful and ragging-free environment. Students were sensitized to the importance of maintaining discipline, fostering healthy peer relationships and contributing positively to campus life.

5. Awareness on the Anti-Ragging Undertaking

During the programme, students were apprised of the Anti-Ragging Undertaking and their responsibilities towards preventing and discouraging any form of ragging within the Institute. The observance reinforced awareness of the seriousness and consequences of ragging and the need for responsible conduct by all students.

03	Respect and dignity Every student should be able to learn and participate free from intimidation or humiliation.
04	Healthy peer relationships Students are encouraged to support one another and contribute positively to campus life.
05	Awareness and accountability Students were reminded of their responsibilities under the Anti-Ragging Undertaking and the seriousness and consequences of ragging.

The observance of Anti-Ragging Day at AIIMS Guwahati on 12 August 2026 marked a strong reaffirmation of the Institute's commitment to a safe, respectful, inclusive and ragging-free academic environment.
